

New Training Requirements for Kansas Commercial Drivers

In 2017, the Kansas Legislature passed House substitute for Senate Bill 40 which deals with sexual exploitation and human trafficking.

The bill requires all truck drivers to take a course in identifying and reporting possible human trafficking activity. This bill is tied to the CDL application and renewal process for CDL drivers. Beginning July 1, 2018, Kansas Commercial Drivers must have certification showing they have completed an online training course in human trafficking identification and prevention in order to receive or renew a commercial driver's license.
